Having both family and friends that were adopted transracially or have adopted transracially, we understand the responsibility we will owe to a child. It is important to us for our child to have teachers, friends, mentors, and spiritual leaders from similar backgrounds.

We understand that our child will have a different cultural background than our own and we promise to seek out these opportunities and resources so that our child grows up knowing and loving every aspect of themselves. We promise to honor every aspect of their identity.
